

You can start and end the walk anywhere, but this description begins and ends at the Lynch Pin pub on Long Furlong Drive.

From the pub (1) head south on Kestrel Path and then diagonally across Lammass Meadow to Whitaker Road (2). Cross the road and through the gate into the Millie.

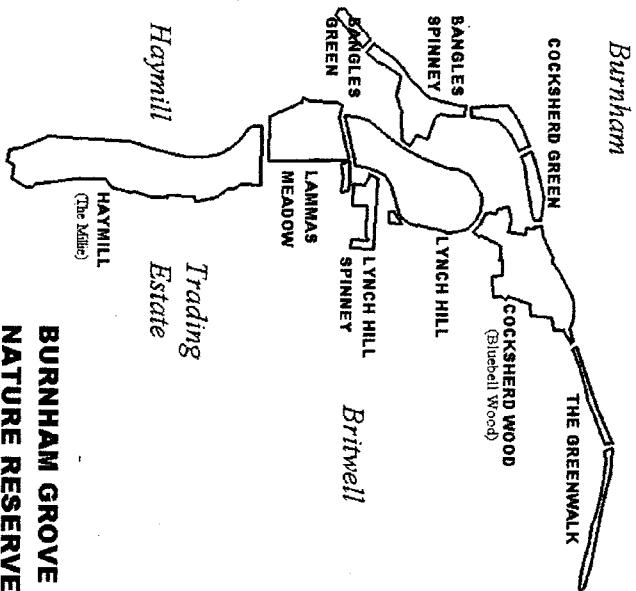
Immediately, turn left over the top of the river culvert and follow the path down the eastern side of the river until you get to a gate opening on your left. Through the gate, immediately turn right down a narrow alleyway (3) which emerges into the buffer zone between the trading estate and the housing estate.

Follow the buffer zone and mounds to Scaffell Road (4) and then up Pentland Road. Climb up the bank into Kennedy Park (5). There is a second bank down at (6). Head across Kennedy Park to Long Furlong Drive (7), then up Wentworth Avenue to Farnham Lane (8).

Follow the Greenwalk along Farnham Lane to Cockshead Wood (9) and through the wood to the gas installation (10). Turn left here, and emerge from the wood at Lynch Hill Lane (11). It is then an easy climb back up towards the starting point at the Lynch Pin pub.

## The Britwell Loop

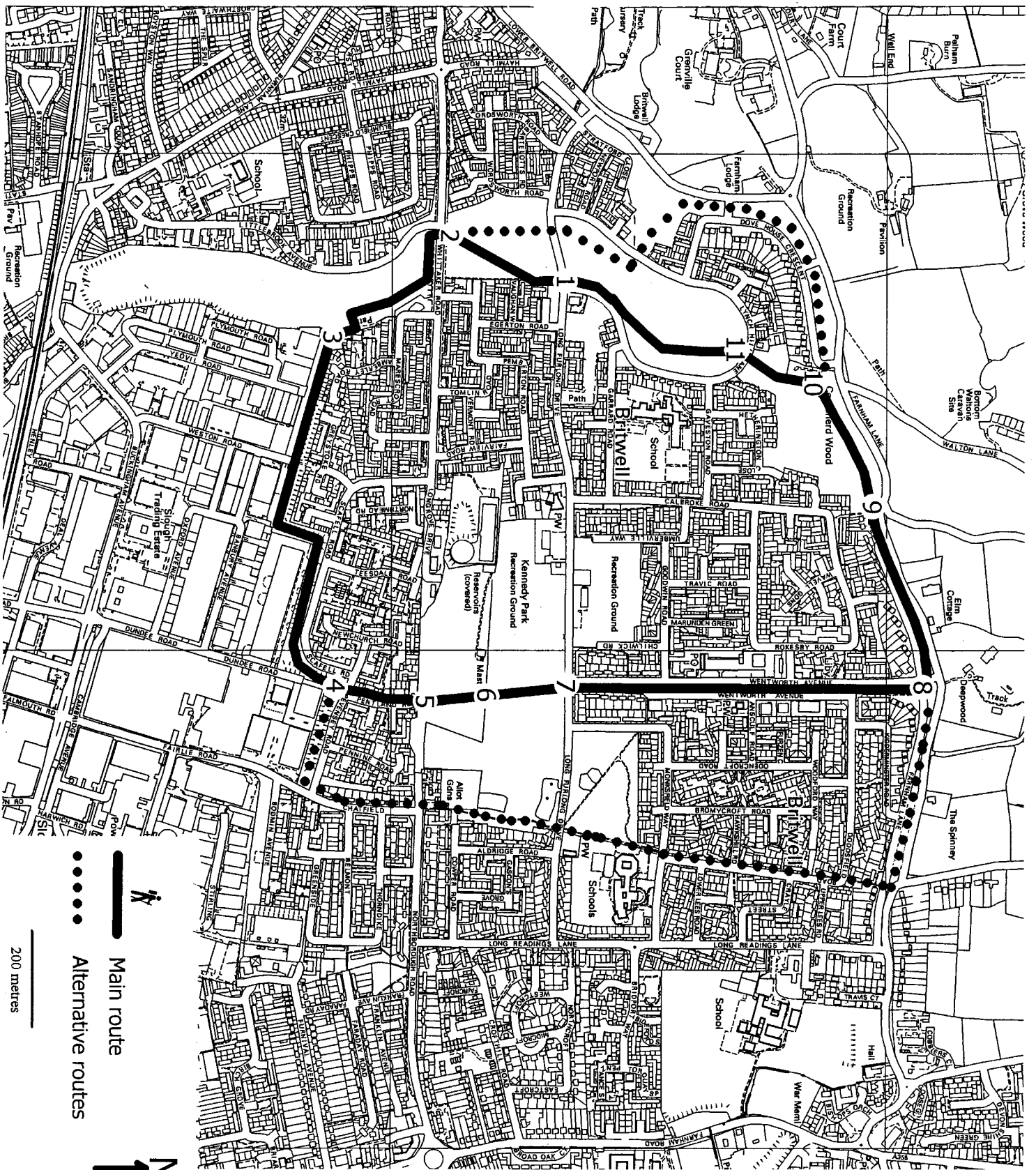
A recreational 4Km walk taking in many of Britwell's green spaces.
